Strathallan School was founded in 1913 in Bridge of Allan, near Stirling, but quickly outgrew its original site. In 1920, the school moved to the Freeland Estate in Forgandenny, a few miles south east of Scotland's ancient capital the City of Perth.



David Giles



With over 40+ international age-grade players, 11 full-time professionals and 9 full Internationalists supported by expert coaches at Strathallan over the last 10 years, the Strathallan Rugby Academy aims to draw out excellence in talented young players through a focused programme.

Shooting

Over the past 12 years, we have been consistently placed in the top 4 at the British Schools' Championships as well as pre-COVID-19 winning the Scottish Schools' Clay Pigeon Championships 13 times in the last 15 years. Since its inception 3 years ago, we have won the renowned Holland & Holland British Independent Schools Competition once and been runners-up twice.

Easter and summer camps

We run a range of residential and non-residential sport and activity camps attended by young people from all over the UK and Europe.


