
# Where we are

Strathallan School was founded in 1913 in Bridge of Allan, near Stirling, but quickly outgrew its original site. In 1920, the school moved to the Freeland Estate in Forgandenny, a few miles south east of Scotland's ancient capital the City of Perth.

The campus is ideally situated for accessing the rest of Scotland, whether you want to head north to the ski slopes or south to the political and cultural centres of Edinburgh and Glasgow. Today's travel connections are simple and regular, with frequent trains from Perth and buses through Forgandenny throughout the day. With 153 acres of safe, secure campus to explore, Strathallan's boarders have some of the most beautiful Perthshire landscape to call home. Packed with rare native plants and wildlife - as well as £25m worth of exceptional facilities - there is always something new to discover, and with regular trips and excursions, it's the ideal home base from which to explore Scotland.

Each international student is allocated into one of Strathallan's seven senior boarding houses, where they are welcomed as a valued member of the House. Unlike some schools, we do not allocate houses based on particular activities and instead focus on creating a balance of interests and talents across all houses. Sibling or family connections can sometimes influence preference to a particular house, but otherwise, the process of matching students to houses is meticulously planned to achieve a broad mix of abilities, interests and previous schools in each house.

Houses are a student's home-from-home, with dedicated staff to oversee every student's well-being, including the Houseparents, Matrons and Academic Tutors. Tutors are involved in all aspects of pupils- well-being and daily life at school. They meet with their tutees at least once per week to monitor academic progress, give support and challenge each pupil to achieve their best.



### **Leaver's Destinations 2024**

Our pupils go on to a range of destinations after Strathallan both in Scotland and the rest of the UK. In 2024, 84% of our pupils achieved their first-choice university while others have headed off to work, college or apprenticeships.

First choice universities in 2024 include: Edinburgh, Durham, Bath, Queens University Belfast, Dundee, Loughborough and Milan Fashion School, St Andrews, Oxford Brookes, Stirling, North Carolina, Exeter, Glasgow, Aberdeen, Newcastle, Heriot-Watt and Trinity College alongside other Russell Group universities.

### **ACADEMIC RESULTS 2024**

# Sport

### **Specialist Sport Programmes**

Our advanced sporting programmes include rugby, hockey, netball, tennis, cricket, swimming, clay pigeon shooting and athletics. These are tailored dependent on the age and stage of the individual.

### Strathallan Sports Academies

Following the success of our Rugby and Shooting Academies, Strathallan is adding Swimming and Tennis to our Sports Academies programme for the 2024-25 session. The Academies are designed to support exceptional young athletes with a tailored training programme and additional professional support to enhance their performance. For many, this gives them the chance to professionally represent their country in their chosen sport.

### Rugby

With over 40+ international age-grade players, 11 full-time professionals and nine full Internationalists supported by expert coaches at Strathallan over the last 10 years, the Strathallan Rugby Academy aims to draw out excellence in talented young players through a focused programme.

### Shooting

Over the past 12 years, we have consistently placed in the top four at the British Schools' Championships as well as pre-COVID-19 winning the Scottish Schools' Clay Pigeon Championships 13 times in the last 15 years. Last season we beat all comers over 3 separate competitions and regained the mantle of British School's Champions. Two pupils have been selected to be part of the junior Olympic and Commonwealth development squad. Two pupils were part of the three-man team that took the bronze medal at the World Junior Championships held in America.

43 Strathallan School pupils will be presented with LAMDA certificates at the start of the new school year. 40 pupils have earned Distinction (80%+), while three have achieved Merit (75%+) Distinctions were achieved by pupils from Years 3 to Sixth Form. The exams covered multiple disciplines, including Acting, The Speaking of Verse and Prose, Choral Speaking, Speaking in Public, and Reading for Performance.

# Extra-curricular activities

One of the things that sets Strathallan apart is the scale of what's on offer outside the classroom. Our extensive programme of extra-curricular activities encourages pupils to build on existing skills, explore new areas of interest and discover hidden talents.

We offer over 80 different activity options – some are linked to academic departments, some are sports, while others are purely recreational. The majority of these are available onsite, meaning less travel time and more educational value – a benefit for day and boarding pupils alike. Our extensive onsite facilities also help to foster a sense of community and mutual ambition – pupils across year groups and Houses can get involved and work towards a shared goal together. There's something for everyone and we're always looking for initiatives to give our pupils new experiences.

We provide such a breadth of activities that every pupil can find an area in which they can shine. With so many activities, clubs and societies on offer at Strathallan, there's never a dull moment.




# My Strathallan life


